"Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." (Isaiah 43:18-19)

'Gray skies are gonna clear up. . ."

Do you know the song I'm referencing here? It is from the musical "Bye, Bye Birdie" and the first line in the song is: "Gray skies are gonna clear up, put on a happy face!" That song came to my mind recently as I was looking back over all that has transpired this past year. I thought about it because gray skies are definitely clearing up each and every Sunday, as we see more and more people attending our in-person worship service each week. It is as if we are seeing the sun come out and we are beginning to bask in its warmth. A "new

normal" is emerging as the vaccines roll out and more activities and events are being planned. I want to say a heartfelt "Thank you" for the patience and compassion you've shown by observing recommended safety precautions and as you continue to do so. Your practices are an exercise of love for the most vulnerable among us. For now, we are still keeping safe, by wearing our masks, and keeping our distance, as recommended by the SC United Methodist Conference Guidelines and CDC recommendations. However, our chancel choir members, handbell choir, as well as the new children & youth handchime choir are now joining with The CORE contemporary music team to add musical variety to our times of worship. Small groups are also starting to meet inside the building and in social gatherings outside the building. The joy and excitement of reconnecting with persons we haven't seen in months is a reminder of how important Christian community is to our spirits and our wellbeing.

While we haven't yet resumed a schedule of multiple services of worship on Sunay mornings, by holding only one in-person service of worship right now, we've been able to get to know persons who in our pre-COVID days attended worship at a different time than we did. As a result, new friendships being forged even as we rekindle old relationships.

With these changes taking place, it feels as if we are going through a "re-birth" of the church. In many ways, it reminds me of the events continued on page 2

CARBONATED HOLY WATER

LAY SERVANT REFLECTIONS - Sandie Weaver

Several weeks ago, I was listening to an interview with an inspirational author who was offering ways to help us deal with the psychological effects of this last year. When she described laughter as "carbonated Holy water", I immediately wanted to get a bottle of that stuff. I felt better just saying the words.

Later I decided to search the scriptures to find out what the Bible said about laughter. In Ecclesiastes 3:4 we are reminded that there is a "time to weep and a time to laugh". In James 5:13 we read if anyone is cheerful, "let him sing praises." But the most comforting scripture I found was Psalm 126 which describes the celebration of the Israelites when the Lord brought them out of captivity. "Then our mouth was filled with laughter and our tongue with joyful shouting. Then they said among the nations, the Lord has done great things for us." To me that absolutely

sounds like "carbonated Holy water."

It seems that in this last year we have been held in captivity. We have been in exile from our family, friends and anything that would have been considered "normal" in our daily lives. So much so, that we have often found it difficult to find anything to smile about, let alone laugh. But laughter is a very useful tool that allows us to deal with pain, break the tension in uncomfortable situations, allows us to rid ourselves of anger and often opens the door for forgiveness.

Perhaps we all need come to the "fountain", take a drink of that "carbonated Holy water", and fill our mouths with laughter as we focus on the great things that the Lord has done for us. We will be refreshed and can look forward to coming out of exile.

that took place on what we call "The birthday of the church" - the day of Pentecost. On that day, the Holy Spirit came as mighty rushing wind – changing everything and everyone in its path. Through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, fear became hope, hesitation turned into action and doubt was transformed into passionate faith. Because of this, the first disciples were able to fulfill Jesus' final commission to "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." Inspired and enflamed in their faith by the Holy Spirit, that small group of unlikely disciples preached the Gospel throughout the known world, continuing the ministry and mission of Jesus. That was the beginning of our magnificent Church and nearly 2000 years later we are called to continue to nurture what was handed on to us. WORSHIP MINISTRIES

Oh give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever." 1 Chronicles 16:34

Of course in all things we should be thankful, but we were especially thankful that this year we were able worship in-person for Holy Week. We started with a beautiful Palm Sunday worship which included music by the Jubilate Ringers and the Core. The congregation waved palm branches as we commemorated Je-sus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. On Ash Wednesday, we gathered outside to begin Lent with a mark of the ashes. It was a solemn reminder of human mortality and need for reconciliation with God. Maundy Thursday we broke bread and shared the wine remembering Jesus' last supper and His commitment to us, his people. We followed a traditional Tenebrae service (Latin for "darkness"). This involved a reading of John's story of the trial, sentencing, execution, death, and burial of Jesus. After each segment was read, a verse was sung and a candle was extinguished symbolizing the descent into darkness.

We gathered on Good Friday for a service Pastor Becky wrote called "Nails of the Cross". Between each reading, a verse of "Were you there" was sung by members of the Core. Congregants picked up nails on their way into the sanctuary, and as they left they had an opportunity to place the nail in a wooden cross symbolizing Jesus' suffering.

To commemorate Jesus Christ's resurrection from death, we began by gathering on the lawn with our sunrise service, followed by our 10 o'clock service where the Choir and Core led the congregation in the celebration of Jesus' triumph over death. At this service we also unveiled the sea glass artwork, where the broken pieces of sea glass that you surrendered as a symbol of giving your brokenness to Jesus, were made into beautiful candle holders as part of the conclusion of our Broken to Beautiful series.

As we continue into the Easter season, you will have opportunity to continue the celebration each Sunday. We invite you to join us as the Core, Choir, and Jubilate ringers rotate Sundays and lift our praises in song, while our Worship Team will keep the congregation artwork

on display up until Pentecost on May 23rd.

PHILLY YOUTH GROUP - PYG


