Dear Church Family,

In a post COVID church, in times of uncertainty, we need to be courageous. We need to lift all that we do before God and allow God, through the power of His Holy Spirit to guide us in very bold and courageous ways. In a world where we live in the fear of uncertainty, in a time in which anxiousness seems to control our decisions, we must have courage, to follow God's way, for His people and His church.

Courage is an essential part of "living well", and it is an absolute requirement if one is going to follow Jesus in any meaningful sort of way, especially in times of hardship. Courage is referenced in Scripture nearly one hundred times.

Usually, courage is written as a command, to "take courage." Where do we find courage? Is there a courage account that we draw from? Is there a map that will show us where to find a chest full of

courage? Is it like a pocketful of miracles or a shower of love, something readily available if only we had eyes to see?


Jesus is only known to have said the word courage one time in the Gospels. "I have said this to you, so that in me you may have peace. In the world you face persecution. But take courage; I have conquered the world!" (John 16:33 NRSV) Jesus wants his followers to understand that courage is rooted in what he had already done. His words echo those of Moses, before his death in Deuteronomy 31.

"Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the LORD your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you." (Deuteronomy 31:6 NIV). On April 23rd, Evangelism partnered with UMM, UMW, and numerous congregational volunteers to host a community service event. We opened our church doors to the public in service; hosting a document shred truck and "The Big Red Bus" for blood donations. The event also included: sanctuary tours, live music (thanks to Renew worship leader Mark Gannon), a UMW bake sale, and UMM BBQ.

During the event, we collected 12 units of blood which is projected to help 36 local patients. Additionally, we collected approximately

\$300 in cash donations and are grateful UMM donated another \$200 from their BBQ sales proceeds to help cover the cost of the Shred America truck.
