


# **ANNUAL FALL FESTIVAL**

Hence the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society was born and has been known by several names over the space of time. This year the name United Methodist Women was changed to United Women in Faith. This organization, whatever name was given, has over the 150 years of its existence has been an advocate for changing the lives of women, children and youth throughout the local community and world.

# 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration Saturday, September 24<sup>th</sup> from 9am-12pm



# PHILLY YOUTH GROUP (PYG)

July was an exciting month. We have started getting to know our new youth director, Jonathan and can't wait for all the ways in which he will help us grow in our relationship to God and each other.

We cooled off at a pool party at the Miller's and served at both Bright Side Youth Ranch and Bethel Men's Shelter. At Bright Side, we cleaned the horse pastures and gave the horses a "spa day". Bright Side founder, Tia, gave us a demonstration on how they use horses to help children and youth cope with circumstances in their lives. She explained that they allow the horses to choose their relationships and when the kids are patient, the horses choose to be in relationship with them. Horses lean in to their relationships and put their full trust in their handlers. This is the type of relationship God wants to have with us. He wants us to choose Him, lean into Him, and put our full trust in Him. It was awesome to see how Bright Side is using God's creatures to nurture youth in crisis.

We helped distribute clothing and toiletries to the guests of the Bethel Men's Night Shelter in Rock Hill. Every night, Bethel opens their doors to homeless men in the area and provides them with a meal, shower facilities, a safe warm place to sleep, a bagged breakfast and essentials they might need. It was a joy to be able to serve at these two facilities and we hope to partner more with them in the future.

We're going back to school on a high note! On August 14<sup>th,</sup> ALL youth rising 6th -12th graders are invited to join us at our Back to School Bash day on the lake. Parents must contact Jonathan if your child will be attending.


# LAY LEADER MOMENT - Tom Goebel

## FINANCE COMMITTEE

The finance committee continues to consider opportunities to better communicate PUMC's financial position based on feedback from the congregation. To that end, please take a moment to look at the Stewardship Report on the back of the bulletin and give us your thoughts.

While giving increased in May, post-pandemic travel increased significantly this summer resulting in lower attendance on Sunday mornings and a summer decline in giving. From January to June 2022 PUMC ,received \$289,476 in total contributions (\$1,146 more than 2021) as compared to expenses of \$305,375. PUMC does remain current on its apportionments to the SC Conference and loan balances have been reduced a further \$18,304 since December.

There are lots of opportunities to serve at PUMC through your prayers, witness and financial contributions which support Missions, Evangelism and Nurture Ministries as well as Children

and Youth programming. If you are on the fence about giving financially, any member of the Finance Committee would be happy to discuss what your gift might mean to specific ministry areas. You can consider beginning or increasing your financial contributions, giving monthly or supporting a specific ministry area.
