Dear Friends,

Recently, Toni and I purchased a trundle bed for our home in Greenville. It allows us to have extra beds for when all the grandchildren spend the night. It also gives us the most bang for our bucks. While searching for the beds, we also searched for the right kind of mattresses for them. The lady at the mattress store suggested 'memory foam' mattresses. Not fully aware of the concept of memory foam, we ordered two and had them delivered.

Imagine our surprise when the delivery guy pulls out two boxes about three feet long and 8 inches wide. "Wait," I told the guy, "we ordered mattresses, what's in the boxes?" Upon opening the boxes and carefully cutting the wrapping from around the mattresses, we were amazed at how something so big, could fit into

such a small package. Not only that, we are amazed at how comfortable they are, especially for children, not for me.

As we continue our sermon series on "The Lord's Prayer", I continue to be amazed at how much there is to learn and understand as we unpack the prayer line by line. It reminds me of the memory foam mattresses, after you unpack them and let them unfold, they expand into more than expected. I pray as we continue this study that we will have a better understanding about how to pray, how the Lord's Prayer helps us become the followers Christ has called us to be and to pray as he taught us saying;

- Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be they name.
- Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.
- Give us this day our daily bread.
 - And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.
 - And lead us, not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.

STAFF PARISH RELATIONS TEAM (SPRT) Welcome Jonathan



FINANCE COMMITTEE

Financial support for the missions and ministries at PUMC continues to improve year over year as the congregation returns from summer vacations to more regular schedules with school, work, and fall activities. In July 2022, giving was \$38,540 as compared to \$31,251 a year ago. While giving remains almost \$8,000 per month below pre-pandemic levels and below the need required to fully support expenses, we celebrate that giving in 2022 has exceeded 2021 in 4 of the last 5 months, loose plate offering is up and attendance in worship and small groups is growing. Thank you for your continued support.

All too often we, as a Christian community, equate Stewardship with the request for financial contributions and management of those funds. While financial support is critical to the success of any organization, God calls us to be good Stewards of all of the physical and spiritual gifts bestowed upon us. We nurture those gifts through prayer, worship, service and financial contributions. In October, PUMC will embark on a study and renewal of our commitment to be faithful Stewards. More information will follow as the Finance and Stewardship Committee work closely with Pastor David on the selection and preparation of that study over the coming month.
