Dear Church Family,

Since 2019, I have answered more questions about The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church than any other time in my 33 years in ministry. These questions have challenged me to examine my calling as a United Methodist pastor and what I value as a servant leader.

I have been a United Methodist all my life. I have witnessed the good and the bad times of the denomination and personally in some the churches I have served. Through it all I have concluded that I am a Christian, who chooses to practice his faith in a United Methodist way. My choice is based upon the "Doctrinal Standards, General Rules and Theological Task" as set forth in our Book of Discipline. I believe our mission is that as Christ commands in Matthew 28:18-20, "To Make disciples of all nations."

I believe in the process for carrying our Our Mission as stated in Paragraph 122 (BOD 2016) and all that follows through paragraph 140.

The Preamble of our faith found under Social Principles states:

"We, the people called United Methodists, affirm our faith in God our Creator and Father, in Jesus Christ our Savior, and in the Holy Spirit, our Guide and Guard. We acknowledge our complete dependence upon God in birth, in life, in death, and in life eternal. Secure in God's love, we affirm the goodness of life and confess our many sins against God's will for us as we find it in Jesus Christ. We have not always been faithful stewards of all that has been committed to us by God the Creator. We have been reluctant followers of Jesus Christ in his mission to bring all persons into a community of love. Though called by the Holy Spirit to become new creatures in Christ, we have resisted the further call to become the people of God in our dealings with each other and the earth on which we live. continued on page 2

Palm Sunday, April 2nd (9:00am & 11:00am) – Celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem with a celebration music and waving of palms. Special music by the Jubilate Ringers. Worshippers of all ages, as they are able, are invited to process into the sanctuary during the prelude and wave their palms in joyous celebration.

Maundy Thursday, April 6th (6:30pm) - Commemorate the last supper of Jesus with communion and reflection. We will join together at 6:30pm in the sanctuary to remember Luke 22: 19-20 Then he took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, 'This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' 20 And he did the same with the cup after supper, saying, 'This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood.

Good Friday, April 7th (6:30pm) - Experience the Passion with your senses. On this day of mourning, we reflect on the Crucifixion of Jesus. Begin in the Fellowship Hall where you are asked to read select scripture verses and then create an image from clay about what you read. These will be used in future worship. Then please go into the sanctuary for a time of reflection, meditation, and music.

Easter Sunday, April 8th we return to celebrate Jesus' resurrection! It is truly a day of celebration!

7:00am - Sunrise service begins at the three crosses in our cemetery. We'll transition to the cross at the front of the church inviting all who pass to be moved by the Holy Spirit. Fellowship with others over a light breakfast in the Fellowship Hall

11:00am – Celebration Service features a special guest brass ensemble along with the Chancel choir and the Core as we join our voices to Proclaim "Christ the Lord Has Risen Today!"

On Easter, to signify and honor Christ's resurrection, it is common for us to sing 'Christ the Lord is Risen Today', and you'll hear this great hymn on Easter morning both at services, but with different accompaniment and arrangement. Did you know this great hymn was written by Charles Wesley, the brother of our Methodist founder, John? As John was a great writer of sermons, Charles was a great composer of hymns. Charles has over 50 of his hymns in our United Methodist hymnal. Some of the other greats are 'And Can it Be', 'O For a Thousand Tongues', and 'Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus'. Another great hymn for Easter by Charles Wesley is 'Hail the Day that Sees Him Rise'. This hymn is strong and memorable as well, although we may not sing it quite as much. Here are a few lyrics from this great hymn of the faith:

"Hail the day that sees Him rise, Alleluia! To His throne above the skies, Alleluia! See! He lifts His hands above, Alleluia! See! He shows the prints of love, Alleluia! Hark! His Gracious lips bestow, Alleluia! Blessings on His church below, Alleluia!" We will be singing 'Hail the Day that Sees Him Rise' this Easter Sunday at 11am. We will also have guest brass musicians accompanying, along with Denise Harding and the choir. I hope this Wesleyan hymn, as well as 'Christ the Lord is Risen Today' is a blessing to you as you ponder Jesus' resurrection this Easter.

Bethel Men's Shelter Overflow

From February 26th to March 12th you may have noticed that the fellowship hall was set up with 25 cots. Or you may have wondered why you spotted a trailer in the parking lot. This was because Philadelphia UMC rose to a call and participated as an overflow shelter to assist Bethel Men's Shelter.

This shelter is part of Bethel UMC in Rock Hill which serves as a men's shelter 365 days of the year. Typically, beds are provided to 30 men. During the winter months this number jumps to 75 men in need. Bethel is not equipped to house this many men so they have developed an overflow shelter where they work with local area churches to provide space so no man is turned away.

Bethel provided all the cots, bedding, and an overnight security officer as a host. Eight different volunteer drivers from Philadelphia drove a BUMC bus each evening and early morning to transport the men back and forth between Rock Hill and Fort Mill so that many could get to their places of employment. The organization and flexibility of Bethel Men's Shelter made this mission an easy partnership. The men set up and broke down their cots each day that Philadelphia needed to use the fellowship hall and maintained a neat and tidy atmosphere. Trustees Chair Gary Brocious, went above and beyond to greet the men every day to assure that the building was satisfactory and the men were comfortable.

Overall, the Bethel Men's Overflow Shelter was a successful ministry. PUMC was able to continue to support our homeless community. Philadelphia is blessed with many volunteers always open to serve. The Overflow Shelter was appreciative of Philadelphia's efforts and has already requested that we serve alongside them again next season. Finally, the Finance Committee is focusing on how we can highlight the importance of increasing giving in the church and at the same time how we can provide financial education to the church and the community. Some of the things that are being planned are 1) a Dave Ramsey Financial Peace course, 2) a Finance/Accounting professional to come to the church to provide information about legacy giving and other personal finance topics, 3) educating and simplifying automated giving to the church. Bethel Men's Shelter Dinner

"We need more meatloaf, more green beans, more potatoes!!" Those were continuous calls from the servers to the kitchen

helpers! What a great evening March 28th was at Bethel Men's Night Shelter! The men asked for and received meatloaf (beef, venison, and turkey)



accompanied by green beans, mashed potatoes, tomatoes, muffins, and banana pudding. Some men tried all three types of meatloaf! They loved the meal and kept praising our wonderful cooks! Numbers were down more than expected - we served about 50 men plus staff - so the leftovers were be frozen and will be used to supplement a meal on a night for which they have no sponsor. Breakfast bags were filled with donations from the congregation and were passed out on the morning of March 29th. We also provided a "grab box" (individual packs of cereal, raisins, crackers, trail mix, etc.) that men could select an item from - they really liked being able to select what they wanted!

A special thank you to the United Methodist Men for providing the funds for the turkey and beef and to Karla and Blair Preston for providing the venison! Also, thanks to those who cooked, donated food items, and served at the shelter as well as those who provided

clothing, towels, tennis shoes, and personal items which we delivered to the donation center.

Our next opportunity to serve will be in the May timeframe. God is good for moving so many of the congregation to support this ministry!


