John 15:9-12 (NLT) "I have loved you even as the Father has loved me. Remain in my love. CHURCH COUNCIL

In 10-months the United Methodist Church's General Conference meets in Charlotte, NC. The General Conference includes representatives from all the UMC's worldwide conferences and meets every four years for a time of prayer, celebration and to address the business of the church. The 2024 agenda will include the issue of homosexuality and disaffiliation of member congregations.

The SC Conference offered a process in December 2022 by which local congregations might disaffiliate from the Methodist Church. The Local Church Discernment Process requires a 30-day discernment period initiated by Church Council, payment of certain obligations to the conference and a congregational vote to request disaffiliation at SC Annual Conference. Congregational votes must occur before March 1st for consideration at the current year's Annual Conference. The Annual Conference must then approve disaffiliations for the separation process to begin. During the week of June 4th, 113 SC Congregations were approved for disaffiliation.

During February, Pastor David and I hosted three information sessions for the congregation to share information, discuss openly and solicit feedback around the issues of homosexuality and the disaffiliation process. About thirty members of the congregation attended. Conversation ranged from doctrinal to practical. In general, those in attendance verbalized a desire to preserve church doctrine and continued on page 2

that PUMC remain open to all seeking God's grace, inclusive and accepting of all membership and visitors. No attendee of the information sessions expressed a desire to explore disaffiliation at this time. Thank you for your participation and feedback.

In late March, PUMC's Church Council agreed to not engage in the discernment process at this time. Council will continue to listen to the concerns of the congregation, review the latest information shared by SC Conference as well as consider any outcomes from the General Conference in 2024. The consensus was that time and energy should remain focused on encouraging and supporting PUMCs worship, ministries, mission, and outreach to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the World through Worshipping, Serving and Growing in Love. By doing so, PUMC remains strong, spiritually healthy and prepared to make tough decisions in the future from foundation of purpose, strength, and love.



FINANCE COMMITTEE

We received some good financial news. We've been waiting for checks from the South Carolina Department of Transportation for the sale of a strip of the church's property and right-of-way use of a portion of our parking lot for the upcoming Hwy 160 construction. In April, we received checks for the full amount of \$187,991. We're required to use the proceeds toward our mortgages and the church building, so roughly \$88k was used to pay off the parsonage and the remainder will be available to pay the church mortgage and/or building expenses. As mentioned in previous newsletters, cash was getting tight, so this came at a perfect time!

We appreciate your efforts to continue regular giving during the summer months. As you can see in this newsletter and in the weekly bulletin, our cash on hand remains low, so it's critical to keep giving as consistent as possible.

Our new Financial Associate Mayra Leon is doing a great job learning the ropes. She is visiting with her grandparents in Peru, but is available through email. The new email for questions on your giving is accounting@pumcformill.org.
