SOAR TO NEW HEIGHTS



Dear Church Family,

As we navigate the challenges and uncertainties of life, it's not uncommon to feel weary, drained, and on the verge of giving up. In times like these, turning to the wisdom found in ancient scriptures can offer solace and inspiration. Isaiah 40:30-31, a timeless passage, provides a profound message of hope and renewal. The passage reads:

"Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength.

They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint."

These verses serve as a reminder that weariness is a universal experience, affecting even the strongest among us. It acknowledges the inevitable trials and tribulations that we all encounter on our life's journey. However, embedded within these words is a powerful promise - the promise of renewed strength for those who place their hope in the Lord. OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

In November, UWF hosted our annual Pancake Packing Party to pack shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child. Items were collected throughout October and even a truck load of donations was brought from Canada by Carol Sine! It was a blessed evening full of wonderful food, servant hearts, and prayer. Attendees started by putting their handprints on the boxes. They added handmade jump ropes, toothbrushes, crocheted pencil pouches, soap and washcloths. Then, they added school supplies, toys and

clothes. Many attendees included cards and letters and then most importantly covered the boxes in prayer. We packed 342 boxes of love! That's 85 more than last year. You also donated over \$3,000 to help with shipping. The following Sunday, Pastor David lead us in prayer over the boxes and later they were delivered to the Charlotte processing center. Thank you to everyone who donated to, helped organize, packed, and prayed for this mission project. You helped introduce children to Jesus and his unconditional love.

Lean on the Divine: Recognize that you don't have to bear the burdens of life alone. Lean on your faith, whatever that may be, and find solace in the belief that there is a higher power guiding your journey.

Seek Renewal: Actively seek renewal through practices that

nourish your mind, body, and spirit. This could include prayer, meditation, self-reflection, or spending time in nature.

Encourage Others: Just as you draw strength from your faith, be a source of encouragement for others. Share the message of hope and renewal with those around you, fostering a community of support.

In the midst of life's challenges, Isaiah 40:30-31 serves as a beacon of hope, reminding us that, no matter how weary we may feel, we have the capacity to soar to new heights with renewed strength. May these verses inspire you to face each day with resilience, hope, and a sense of purpose during this season of Advent.


