EXPLORING "THE LAST THREE DAYS"

Dear Church Family,



The birth and resurrection of Jesus changed our world and continues to change our lives. It's a profound journey that we often discover through the most unlikely people, offering us a unique perspective on the resurrection of Christ.

I invite you to join Toni and I as we dig into the heart of Lent and explore "The Last Three Days". During this study, we'll walk in the footsteps of Mary Magdalene, experiencing hope in her journey. Next, we'll follow Simon Peter, understanding how a new life in Christ can restore and give purpose. Thomas, in the middle of a crisis of faith, will teach us about the way the risen Lord seeks us.

The road to Emmaus will introduce us to a pair of disciples who, though hearing of Jesus' presence, lost their sense that God was still working. Experience the real presence of Christ alongside them.

Saul of Tarsus, once an opponent of Jesus, underwent a life-changing encounter, transforming not only his life but also his name. In our last session together, we'll explore the purpose of the Resurrection-how it fulfilled Jesus' proclamation of the kingdom of God and the power that makes the kingdom possible on earth as it is in heaven.

MISSIONS: FEED MY SHEEP

Bethel Men's Night Shelter January 22nd was a night to remember as we planned to serve the largest number of men we've ever fed - 100 men! We started late afternoon at the church collecting donated food and drink items, packing jelly in individual containers, and cooking turkey sausage and biscuits. Loaded to the gills, our five vehicle caravan headed to Bethel to meet our other volunteers! Arriving there felt totally chaotic - unloading the vehicles, lots of volunteers and guests around - we had so much - where to put it all??? The chaos soon settled into efficiency as groups wiped down tables, set up the serving line, drink table, found a home for all the crockpots, filled breakfast bags, starting cooking gravy, more grits, biscuits, and eggs, then finally carrying items up to the Donation Center. The men were lined up down the sidewalk and across the parking lot - 103 of them in total!! Tables were packed and men ate on the floor, on suitcases and any other horizontal surface they could find! A great hot home cooked breakfast is something they

no longer receive. They kept raving about how wonderful the food was and were wondering who prepared it all! Forty pounds of scrambled eggs, 7+ crockpots of grits, 50+ pounds of cooked apples, many quarts of gravy, a 14 pound country ham, 350+ pork and turkey sausage patties and around 300 biscuits - all devoured by the men. The night was such a blessing - the regulars now know us and are happy to see us as they know we really care, and they will get an awesome meal!

WORSHIP COMMITTEE

Lent Begins Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14th and ends on Holy Saturday (day before Easter). The season is a preparation for celebrating Easter. Historically, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by converts and then became a time for penance by all Christians. The First Sunday describes Jesus'



temptation by Satan; and the Sixth Sunday (Palm Sunday), Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem and his subsequent passion and death. Because Sundays are always 'little Easters,' the penitential spirit of Lent should be tempered with joyful expectation of the Resurrection.

Ash Wednesday: Service of Worship February 14th - 6:30pm.

The Lenten season is a preparation for celebrating Easter as we confront our own mortality and confess our sin before God within the community of faith. The use of ashes as a sign of mortality and repentance has a long history in Jewish and Christian worship. Worshippers are invited to participate in the Imposition of Ashes, (marking the forehead with the sign of the cross using ashes of palm leaves). This ancient practice can be a powerful nonverbal and experiential way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation. The ashes we use are from the burning of the palms we used on Palm Sunday of the previous year.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

PUMC celebrates and thanks you for supporting its missions and ministries with over \$651k in contributions to the General, Building and Designated Funds during 2023. This represents a 5% increase over 2022: the first increase in annual giving since 2016. PUMC also experienced a 3% increase in the number of families contributing during the year. In December, PUMC received \$79k in General Fund Contributions (and \$19k in designated gifts): the largest December contributions since 2018!

During 2023, PUMC paid 100% of its apportionment. Total General and Building Fund Expenses were \$623k. This amount was \$110k less than its \$733k budget. Based on lower actual expenses along with current economic realities Church Council reduced PUMCs operating budget by \$88k for 2024 to \$645k. Apportionment payments will decline again in 2024 and all ministry areas including staffing, office, and trustees agreed to budget reductions.

We thank you again for your generous gifts to PUMC during 2023 and appreciate your commitment in 2024 to support our mission "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world".

PHILLY YOUTH GROUP (PYG)

PYG was back it this January as we started a study called "Beneath the Surface" which focuses on finding God's identity for us by looking closely at the stories from the early life of Jesus. The cold and dark early evenings had us inside more, so we had to pull the 9 Square In the Air out! We also had a scavenger hunt in the Fort Mill area. Several parents volunteered to drive teams around Fort Mill to find different locations and earn points. The winning team scored a giant trophy and bragging rights!

Looking ahead, we have Mission Wednesdays starting back on select Wednesdays from 6-7pm where we will work on projects for Bethel Men's Shelter, animals in shelters, and PUMC's Sunshine Ministry (homebound). Registration for our Spring Retreat at Lookup Lodge in Travelers Rest on April 19th-21st will open in February as well as our Salkehatchie Camp the week of July 13th-20th. Founded by a PUMC member, Hugaroo is a humanitarian effort to provide new stuffed animals to organizations helping children heal during illnesses or traumatic conditions. We will start collecting animals in late February. Stuffed animals should be new, 10"-12" in size, huggable - soft and squishy -



and have stitched eyes (no plastic eyes). On Sunday, April the 14th at noon, we will have lunch and work on prepping and bagging the animals for disbursement.



Children's Church meeets after Wee Worship at both 9am and 11am.




