# **OFFERINGS & REFLECTIONS THOMAS "THE CURIOUS"**



#### Dear Church Family,

Now Thomas (also known as Didymus[a]), one of the Twelve, was not with the disciples when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!" But he said to them, "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." ~ John 20:24-25 (NIV)

In reading John 20:24-29, I became curious about Thomas and why he was not with the other disciples when Jesus appears to them on the third day. Did he need time alone to grieve? Did he need time alone to process the events of the last 72 hours? Was it his turn to prepare the meal and he had to go to market? We just don't know? Yet, Thomas is labeled as "Doubting Thomas."

When returning to be with the others, they shared with Thomas they had seen the Lord, the Lord had been in their presence. What was going through Thomas' mind at that point? What caused him to respond the way that he did? Is it really doubt or is it curiosity?

I believe that Thomas was curious. I believe that Thomas was seeking to have a personal encounter with Christ, he wanted his own story to tell...he wanted to believe...but in order to believe, he had to see and experienced presence of Jesus for himself.

What can we learn from Thomas? How can we share our personal experience, our faith, our belief with others? How can we help others experience Christ love?

As we continue this journey through lent, ponder these questions as ways we can learn from Thomas, "The Curious."

**Palm Sunday, March 24**<sup>th</sup> (9:00am & 11:00am) – Celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem with a celebration music and waving of palms. John 12: 12-13 "The next day the great crowd that had come for the festival heard that Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem. They took palm branches and went out to meet him, shouting, 'Hosanna!" 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!' 'Blessed is the king of Israel!""

**Maundy Thursday, March 28**<sup>th</sup> (6:30pm) - Experience the last supper of Jesus through the 'Living Last Supper' and communion. Based on the painting by Leonardo da Vinci, PUMC actors will help us to imagine Jesus' last night with his disciples in the Upper Room. We will then share the bread and the cup in remembrance of that night.

**Good Friday, March 29<sup>th</sup> (6:30pm) -** On this day of mourning, we reflect on the Crucifixion of Jesus through a Tenebrae Service. Scriptures are read and darkness will gradually increase. Worshipers leave in silence to ponder the impact of Christ's death and await the celebration of the coming Resurrection.

**Easter Sunday, March 31<sup>st</sup> -** We return to celebrate Jesus' resurrection! It is truly a day of celebration!

**7:00am** - Sunrise service begins at the three crosses in our cemetery. We'll transition to the cross at the front of the church inviting all who pass to be moved by the Holy Spirit.

**9:00 & 11:00am** – Celebration Services with special music and guest musicians! We invite you to bring live flowers to decorate our living cross as we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior. There will be four locations available for family Easter pictures.

You can still pick up a bottle (or a 2<sup>nd</sup>) after Sunday service. Pray over this bottle and the clients of PWC, fill the bottle with change or other monies as you remember Jesus' sacrifices, and return it either on Palm Sunday or Easter Sunday when we celebrate Jesus' victory over death.

#### Hugaroo - Stuffed Animal Collection

We continue to collect new huggable stuffed animals for our April14<sup>th</sup> lunch and animal prep event. This service opportunity is for all ages - preschoolers can count, bag and move animals from station to station, children through senior adults can remove labels/tags, repair tears and add Hugaroo tags. What a great time for all ages to interact and have fun together!

Stuffed animals should be new, unused and about 10"-12". They

should be huggable - soft and squishy - and have stitched eyes (no plastic eyes). These new stuffed animals are provided to organizations helping children heal during illnesses or traumatic events.

#### Chili Cook Off Winner Lucky Steak Chili - Matt Miller

2 T vegetable oil	1 lg red onion, chopped	
1/2 bulb garlic, pressed	1 lb ground beef	
3/4 lb beef sirloin, cubed	20oz Guiness	
1 14 oz can beef broth	1 cup strong brewed coffee	
1 14.5oz can diced tomatoes with juice		
2 6oz cans tomato paste	4 15oz cans kidney beans	
3 T and 1 1/2 tsps chili powder	1 T unsweetened cocoa powder	
1 tsp ground cayenne	1 tsp dried oregano	
4 fresh red chili peppers, seeded, chopped		
1/2 cup packed brown sugar	1 T cumin seeds	
1 tsp ground coriander	salt to taste	
chopped green onions	Extra sharp shredded cheese	

1. Heat oil over medium heat. Liberally salt chopped sirloin and ground beef, and cook with onions and garlic for 10 minutes, or until the meat is well browned and the onions are tender.

2. Mix in the diced tomatoes with lager, beef broth, coffee, tomatoes with juice and tomato paste.

3. Season with brown sugar, chili powder, cumin, cocoa powder,

oregano, cayenne, coriander and salt. Stir in 2 cans of beans and chili peppers. 4. Reduce heat to low and simmer for 1 ½ hours. Stir in the 2 remaining cans of beans and simmer for another 30 minutes. Season to taste, top with scallions and cheese, serve



#### Dessert Bake Off Winner Argentinian Chocotorta

Chocotorta is an easy Argentinian dessert. It is made out of chocolate cookies dipped in regular milk and layered with a dulce de leche sauce. Chocolinas are the traditionally used cookies, available everywhere in Argentina (or on Amazon). Gisel



didn't realize we didn't have these cookies in traditional American grocery stores, so we didn't order them in time. After discovering we couldn't find Chocolinas at the store, Nathan offered to make brownies instead. Gisel brought jars of dulce de leche with her. You can find it on Amazon or make it yourself. Nathan made two 9x13 pans of brownies and Gisel mixed one cup of dulce de leche with one cup of heavy whipping cream. Half was poured onto one of the pans of brownies, then she placed the second layer of brownies, followed by the rest of the sauce. Enjoy!

### **STEWARDSHIP TEAM**

Thank you to all who continued your financial support of PUMC's missions and ministries in January. During the month, PUMC received \$33k in support for the General and Building Fund plus an additional \$4k in support for ministry areas like Missions, Children and Youth. While giving declined from January 2022 and 2023, that resulted from the strong support received in the last weeks of December combined with two larger gifts moving to later in the year.

Monthly expenses of \$47k were \$6k under budget. Most ministry areas have lower expenses in January and the timing of payroll results in staff support remaining under-budget 10 months out of the year. Besides staff support and our facilities, giving during January supported youth activities and the renewal of copyrights for our music ministries among other items.

Outside of financial gifts, the church received many in-kind gifts
