# **KNOW THAT I AM GOD**



Dear Church Family,

Psalm 46 (NIV)

This popular saying comes from Psalm 46:10, Be still, and know that I am God...

This verse comes from a longer section of Scripture that proclaims the power and security of God. Being still is not just about physical stillness, but also about quieting our minds and hearts to truly know and experience the presence of God. In the stillness, we can center ourselves, listen to His voice, and deepen our connection with Him. It is through this stillness that we can find peace, guidance, and a deeper understanding of God's power and security. While the threat the psalmist faced is not mentioned specifically, it seems to relate to the pagan nations and a call for God to end the raging war.

...God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam and the mountains quake with their surging. There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy place where the Most High dwells. God is within her, she will not fall; God will help her at break of day. Nations are in uproar, kingdoms fall; he lifts his voice, the earth melts. The LORD Almighty is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress. Come and see what the LORD has done, the desolations he has brought on the earth. He makes wars cease to the ends of the earth. He breaks the bow and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire. He says, Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth. The LORD Almighty is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress.

# PHILLY YOUTH GROUP (PYG)

PYG completed their second semi-annual stream cleanup in April. A stream cleanup sounds like a nice leisurely stroll to pick up a few plastic water bottles. But, as you can see from the pictures, our stream is littered with some serious trash as well as some serious southern bugs and other obstacles. With the helping hands of 21 volunteers, we removed a cast iron sink, bicycle, and a tire adding to a total of 320.5 pounds of trash! Look for our sign coming soon to Harris Street Park where our stream adoption will be made official.

We had four adults and ten youth attend the Spring Youth Retreat at Look Up Lodge in Travelers Rest. The weather was amazing allowing us to spend lots of time in God's creation. Some even braved the chilly water! The girls beat the boys in wiffle ball, but the boys beat the girls to every meal. Students had fun enjoying the campus and spending time together playing games, team building, and studying scripture. We had four small group sessions. The series we studied was called "By Name." Youth learned how God created each of the billions of people just like he created all the stars and knows every single one intimately. We created string art to resemble how he knit

**Be still.** Do we know how to be still? Do we know when to just be quiet in God's presence? Do we know how to stop frantic activity? For Gods people being still will involve looking to the Lord for help. Can we just Be Still?

**Know that I am God.** How do we know God? In the stillness of God's presence, we can find solace and peace. It is through being still that we can quiet our minds and open ourselves up to truly experiencing God's presence. By taking the time to be still, we can deepen our connection with Him and gain a deeper understanding of His word and will for our lives. WE know that God is all-knowing, present everywhere, and all-powerful, holy, faithful, infinite, and sovereign. Acknowledging God implies that we can trust Him and surrender to His place because He understands who we are.

When we are still and surrendered to God, we find peace even when the earth gives way, the mountains fall (verse 2), or the nations go into an uproar and kingdoms fall (verse 6). When life gets overwhelming and busyness takes precedence, remember Psalm 46:1, God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. Run to Him, lay down your weapons and fall into His arms. Acknowledge that He is God and that He is exalted in all the earth. Be still and know that He is God.



# FINANCE COMMITTEE

Thank you to the congregation for supporting the Fire Safety and Church Security fundraiser! Church Council, Trustees and Finance/Stewardship moved forward with the fundraising initiative thanks to the valuable feedback received from a limited survey of contributors to PUMC conducted in late 2023. The survey assessed church purpose, communication, motivations for giving and priorities that might be supported. The response rate was 70% with respondents split between 9am and 11am worship attendees. The survey indicated the following:

- PUMC's primary responsibility in supporting its memberships spiritual growth is facilitating effective Worship/Prayer followed by Christian Education
- This newsletter remains a critical source of information for our congregation
- All respondents indicated commitment or scriptural guidance as a primary motivator for giving and overwhelming selected Food Security followed by Shelter missions as a primary community need
- And, about 2/3's of respondents indicated a willingness to support capital giving outside of tithes and offerings provided the purpose and intent is clearly communicated or identified as a critical need of PUMC

Thank you for those who provided this feedback which greatly assisted Council and the committees of the Church in shaping its areas of focus for 2024 in light of the available resources.


# **York County Foster Closet**
