UNBIND YOUR HEART



Dear Church Family,

In the summer of 2016, I took a 40-day sabbatical to study, be in devotion and prayer. This was an intentional time for self-care and spiritual direction to reignite my purpose in ministry and my relationship with Christ.

Following the 2016 UMC General Conference and prior to the General Conference 2024, the United Methodist Church began exploring ways to be more inclusive, accepting and loving to all people. I struggled with the changes being proposed, and my heart was growing hard because I was not willing, nor ready, at that time, to accept the purposed changes. I sought a way for God to unbind my heart. I entered into 40 days of prayer, fasting, listening, and faith sharing. Each morning began with scripture, a reading, action, and journaling. It was a very transforming time in my life and ministry.

I kept a journal during my sabbatical, and I recently discovered it tucked away on a shelf. One journal entry began with the scripture, 1 John 3:14-24. My devotion for that day was entitled "A Gift of Christ's Love." I'd like to share some excerpts from that reading.

"Sit quietly and ask the Spirit of Christ to be with you. Rest in Christ for a minute or two. When you feel ready to be open to the Word of God, read this beautiful portion from the first letter of John. 'Love is the sign of the Christian. Being in Christ means that the love of Christ lives in us. When we know Christ's love, the Spirit will prompt us in words and acts of love.'

Read the scripture again, ponder the words in your heart. Ask Christ, is there someone whom you would like me to give something to show your love? A name of a face may appear to as you pray."

It did. It happened. I saw the person I needed to show love to. It was me. I did not love myself as Christ loves me. All this anger and bitterness about something that I had no control over was binding my heart and keeping me from opening myself to the leading of the Holy Spirit. WOW! I was sure it would be someone else or something else, but it wasn't... it was me. As my 40 days progressed, my heart continued on page 2

Staff Spotlight: David Hodges - Director of Music Ministries

David joined our staff in October 2022. He leads rehearsals for the Adult Chancel Choir and Handbells, and the children's Beginner Bells. You can find him at the office Monday -Thursday preparing for the week's music rehearsals, as well as Sunday's 11am service. All six musical groups (Chancel Choir, CORE, Handbells, Beginner Bells, and children's choirs: Joyful Noize and Philly Chimes) rehearse on Wednesday nights and David coordinates times and rehearsal spaces for them. He also coordinates with other staff and children's choir volunteers to ensure our children can present their musical offerings during worship on a regular basis. In their occasional absence, he assists by leading rehearsals. One of David's most treasured duties is selecting music for worship. David says: "It's a delicate



and prayerful process picking out the music each week. I put a lot of thought and prayer into it, and the Holy Spirit leads."

Some of his other duties include ordering music and supplies for musical groups, overseeing the music budget, ensuring proper tuning and care for our pianos and organ, setting up tables and instruments for handbells, and making myriads of photocopies for rehearsals. A new duty for David involves creating lyric slides each week for congregational singing. David says this was a learning curve for him, but with Nic's help, he picked it up pretty quickly. David also attends worship committee meetings, as well as church council meetings.

David is a graduate of USC (BM) and Winthrop (MM). He met his wife, Carrie, at Winthrop. Carrie, an elementary music teacher, has been a welcome addition to the adult choir, as she is able to move between singing soprano and alto. She also accompanies on flute quite often. David and Carrie have two sons, Johnathan (14) and James (10). Johnathan plays football and James is a budding musician, playing piano and participating in our children's choirs. Additionally, David performs on trumpet with the Union Symphony in Monroe, NC and the Catawba River Winds community band. He loves Gamecock football, and follows the Atlanta Braves. He also teaches private trumpet lessons around Rock Hill and Fort Mill. Thank you David for your beautiful contribution of music to PUMC!


