Good news! Our boys and girls bathrooms in the Sunday School Wing are working again. We owe a big thanks to Giles Plumbing for their persistence in determining the blockage to our sewer pipe. The trustees also appreciate the assistance that the church received from York County Water and Sewer and York County Gas. Without their help we would have spent more dollars and time locating the blockage.

The blockage was caused by a full septic tank. It was easy to miss the opportunity to pump out our septic tank because the lid to the tank was four feet underground. We have now fixed that problem by installing a riser at ground level that will give us access to the under-ground septic tank (see picture). Thank you for your contributions to the general fund which will help to pay for this expenditure.

We also need to thank Bobby Burgess and Steve Walters for installing the final cables for the Wi-Fi/Church Security project at no cost to the church. With all of the data cables installed, the trustees have schedule an appointment for a contractor to run one




